What is Web 2.0?

Web 2.0, is the ¹2nd generation of the World Wide Web. It is focused on allowing people to interact with webpages. Web 2.0 refers to the change between static HTML pages (almost like a book) to dynamic HTML pages (to include videos, pictures, java script etc.) It was also the 1st concept to deliver applications over the web. Instead of installing a piece of software locally on your machine, it would be based on a different machine on the Internet. Web 2.0 also allowed site users to attach tags to items that they post of websites to make it easier to search for. Web 2.0 also allowed webpage makers to create forms for people to fill in. It could also include time based media.

What is the WWW?

The World Wide Web is a system of linked HTML pages accessed using the Internet. It was created by Tim Berners-Lee, a scientist at CERN. He wanted to create a platform for other scientists at CERN to share their research with each other. When webpages are viewed on a web browser they can display pictures, video and text.
